If you're playing recorded music, or authorizing live music, chances are that you require a music licence.

Businesses are legally required to pay a licensing fee when music is played in spaces accessible to the general public.

Nearly 90% of customers agree that music creates a better atmosphere, and it's great value too - the majority of bars, restaurants and retailers pay less than \$1 a day.

There are two music licensing (public performance) organizations authorized by the Copyright Board of Canada:

Music licensing is a vital income stream for artists and songwriters, and is essential for them to continue creating the music used in your business.
